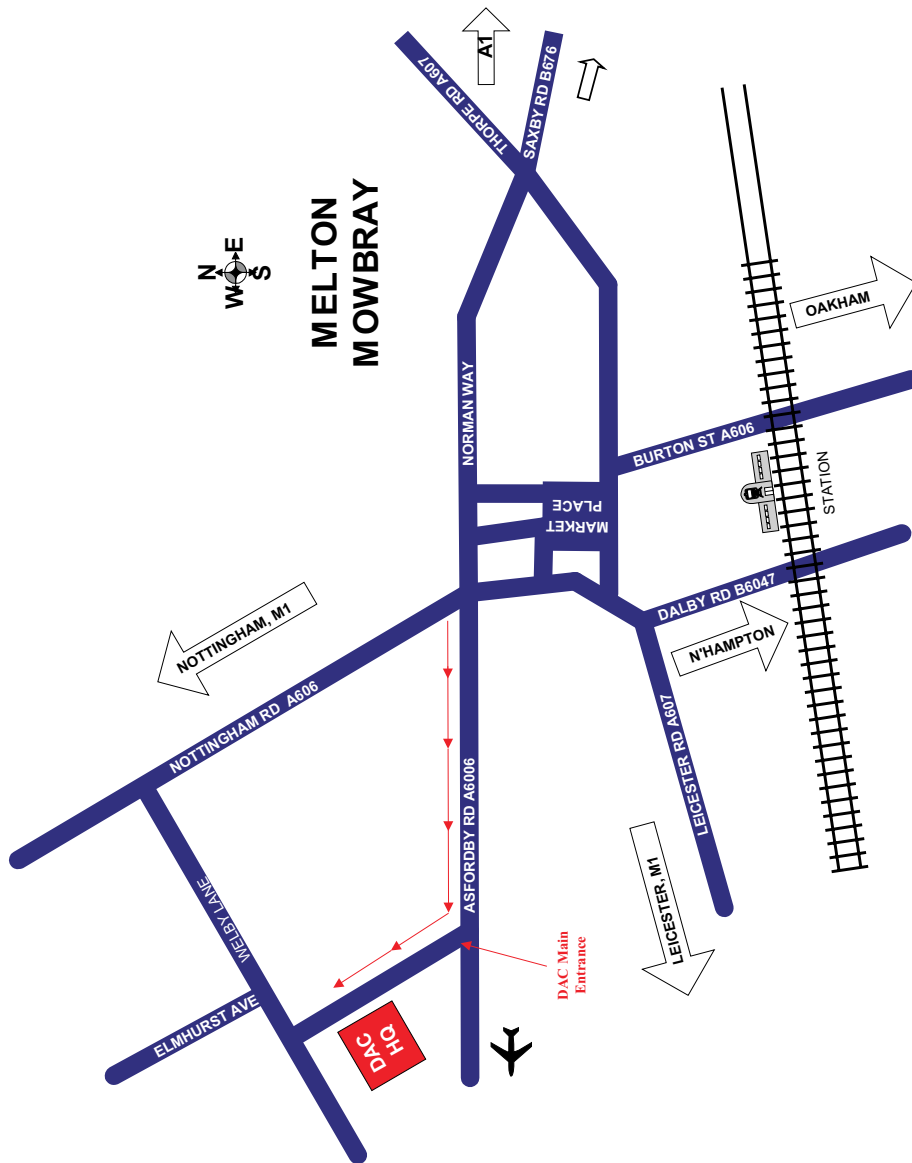

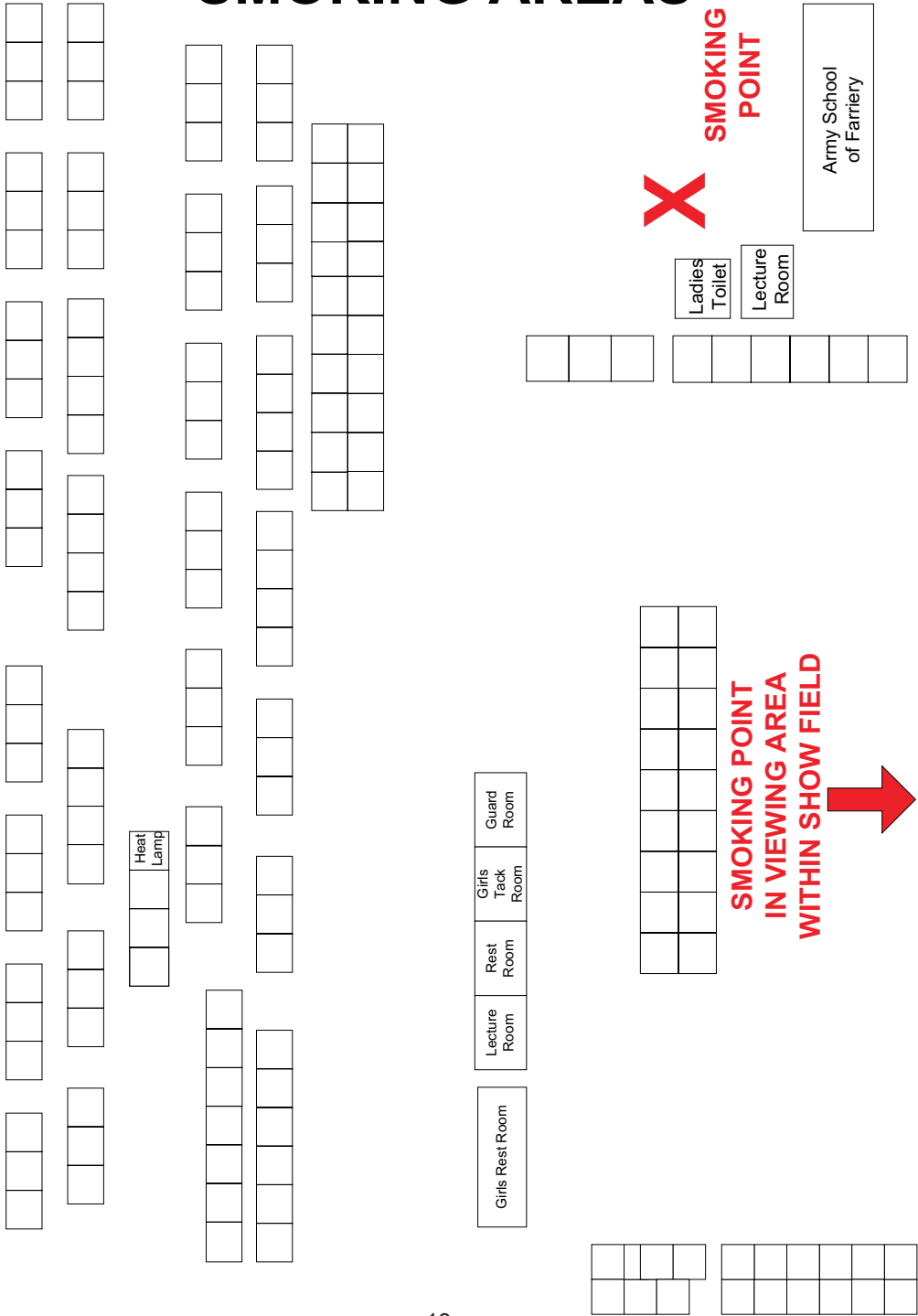

FOREWORD BY CAPT R. I. CHAMBERS LG

The staff at the Army School of Equitation would like to welcome all competitors and spectators to this years Royal Tournament Jumping and Skill at Arms Championships. Over the next four days, we hope to see many new combinations taking part in classes ranging from Tent Pegging to the Derby Jumping. We have managed to gain some new sponsorship and this will ensure the competition remains at the highest standard. We hope that everyone has an exciting and successful week.

There have been changes to the rules for some classes. All Chef d'Equipes are to be aware of this and ensure that entries are correctly completed.

NOTES

1. BSJA Rule 77.3.6

A horse or pony which has competed in affiliated or unaffiliated/ minor competitions 'Hors Concours', is not allowed to compete subsequently for prizes in the same arena on the same day.

2. OLYMPIA QUALIFICATION 2010

Riders will qualify at the Royal Tournament Show Jumping Competition on a points system, i.e. 10 points for first, down to 1 point for tenth. There will be eight places to compete for.

Points will be awarded in the following classes only:

- a. The Prince of Wales Cup
- b. The King's Cup
- c. The Queen's Cup
- d. The Senior Derby

Riders who qualify more than one horse may decide which **ONE** they compete on at Olympia.

The rider and horse combination will qualify. Riders may only compete horses that they have ridden for 6 months or more, or competed on at the preceeding Royal Tournament. This is to eliminate the use of hirelings, which is forbidden.

The final selection, based on the results obtained at the Royal Tournament, will be decided by a panel comprising of the Chairman CSEA, Director of the Royal Tournament, the Riding Master HCMR and the EI KTRHA.

3. DOGS

NO dogs are allowed at the Defence Animal Centre.

4. SMOKING

There is an MOD Unit NO SMOKING policy within the Equine Division. There are 2 designated smoking areas only as shown on the stable plan.

SECURITY, CRIME PREVENTION AND HEALTH & SAFETY

In the interests of Health & Safety, security and to prevent unnecessary loss of or damage to property, the following notes are offered as a guide to all participants and spectators at the Army School of Equitation's Royal Tournament Show Jumping and Skill at Arms Championships.

1. Ensure your vehicle pass is displayed prominently in your vehicle **at all times**. You are to be aware of the H & S notice on the reverse.
2. Do not leave bags / packages lying around unattended.
3. If you leave your vehicle unattended for any reason, ensure that the vehicle is secure and any valuables are locked away.
4. Park only in designated parking areas.
5. In the event of a security incident, obey all instructions given by members of staff of the Defence Animal Centre.
6. All non military visitors must wear passes at all times.

HEALTH AND SAFETY

1. The organiser of this event has taken reasonable precautions to ensure the Health and Safety of everyone present.
2. For these measures to be effective, everyone must take reasonable precautions to avoid and prevent accidents occurring and must obey the instructions of the organiser, the officials and stewards.
3. It is strongly recommended that all civilian competitors take out personal accident cover if they have not already done so.
4. A Health and Safety board will be next to the Commentary Box of which all personnel are to read and take note.

2. Jumping competitions are judged under BSJA rules. For Royal Tournament Competitions normal BSJA registrations rules will be waived. No competitor may compete Hors concours in any class. Open to all serving ranks, regular and auxiliary, of the Armed Forces and members of any Police Force, Prison Service, HM Revenue & Customs or CPS

CLASS 5 - MILITARY FUTURES CUP (RING 1) (ENTRY FEE £10)

Table A7 Speed 325mpm

Open to novice riders serving regular or auxiliary of the Armed Forces and members of any Police Force.

The course is aimed at novice riders starting out in competitions.

All entries should be made in the spirit of the competition (and confirmed by team Captains). For riders not competing in classes 9, 10 and 14.

The course will be set at 85cm with two obstacles set at 90cm

CLASS 6 - PRINCESS ANNE CUP (RING 1) (ENTRY FEE £10)

Table A7 Speed 325mpm

Open to all members of the Armed Forces and members of any Police Force riding horses owned by the MOD / Saddle Clubs or themselves. Subject to special conditions horses competing in the competition will not be eligible to compete in the Kings Cup and Queen's Cup. Horses having won or been placed in the King's Cup or the Prince of Wales Cup are not eligible to compete. Horses must not have won more than £60 in any jumping competition.

The course will be set at 1.00m with two obstacles set to a maximum of 1.05m.

CLASS 7 - PRINCE OF WALES CUP (RING 1) (ENTRY FEE £10)

Table A7 Speed 325mpm

Open to all serving ranks, regular and auxiliary, of the Armed Forces and members of any Police Force. Any horse may compete.

The course will be set at 1.10m.

CLASS 8 - TEAM JUMPING (RING 1) (ENTRY FEE £20 PER TEAM)

Open to teams of 3 from serving units of the Armed Forces or Police. No horse or rider may compete in more than one team and only horses entered in the individual competitions are eligible to compete. A maximum of 4 teams per Unit.

This course will be set at 1.05m. All three team members will enter the arena together, the first team member will start their round, once this is completed the time will be recorded and the bell will sound for the next team member and so on. Once all team members have jumped, their faults will be added together, as will their times to give an overall team time and team faults. In the event of an equality of faults, teams are to nominate one team member to jump off against the clock. (Note: This will only be for teams on a total of 0 faults, all other teams will be placed on faults, then time). If a team member is eliminated this will not eliminate the team, but the competitor will be awarded the score of the worst round in the competition plus a further 20 faults.

CLASS 9 - KINGS CUP (RING 1) (ENTRY FEE £10)

Table A7 Speed 325mpm

The course will be set at a maximum of 1.15m for the first round.

CLASS 10 - THE QUEENS CUP (RING 1) (ENTRY FEE £10)

Table A8 (Two rounds and a jump off) Speed 325mpm.

Ground conditions will be taken into account and, if deemed unsuitable, the class will be run under Table A7. The decision will be made on the day of the Class.

Open to the horses who have not competed in The Princess Anne Cup.

The course will be set at Foxhunter standard. (First round not to exceed 1.20m.)
NB: Competitors are reminded that there are no qualifying rounds for classes 9 & 10.
